

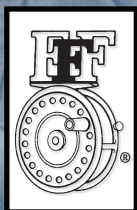

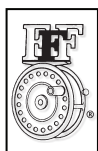

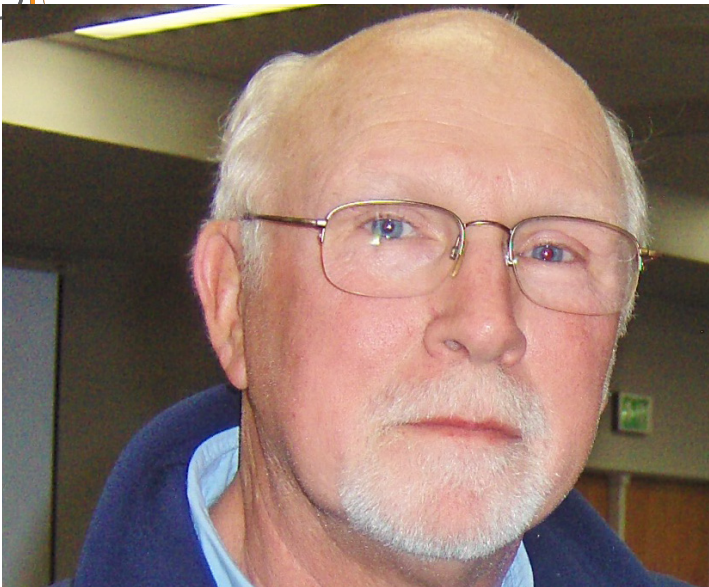

## *Central Oregon Flyfishers spells it out by doing it!*

### **The Role of Conservation in Fly Fishing Clubs**

Conservation should be the cornerstone for all fly fishing clubs. It should be the thread that permeates all club activities. In the Central Oregon Flyfishers (COF), it starts with the mission: *"To promote the preservation and conservation, for future generations, of Central Oregon's watershed and its fisheries through education, the practice of stewardship and the art of fly fishing. Our goal is to provide an opportunity for its membership to participate in a community of fly fishing, fellowship and public service."* In the COF, we focus our conservation efforts on angler education and volunteerism. We have an excellent monthly on-line newsletter <http://www.coflyfishers.org/cof/cofnewsletters.php> containing articles that have addressed such topics as the best catch and release techniques, control of aquatic invasive species, water conservation and management, fisheries biology, and fish passage. Many of the articles provide suggestions on how club members can set a good example for other anglers. Many of the club monthly meetings have representatives from natural resource agencies that provide updates on timely conservation topics such as periodic electro-fishing removal of largemouth bass from Davis Lake to control aquatic invasive species.

The club also promotes volunteerism for conservation projects of state and federal natural resource agencies such as the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, the U.S. Forest Service and nonprofit organizations such as Trout Unlimited and the Upper Deschutes Watershed Council. In an era of shrinking operational budgets, these resource agencies depend on volunteers from fly fishing clubs to accomplish their projects. For example, COF members contribute hundreds of volunteer hours annually assisting in streamside restoration projects, conducting electro-shocking and aquatic insect sampling on the Crooked River, and helping with fishery surveys in local national forest streams and Tui chub removal from high country lakes.

One of the club's major projects is the Kokanee Karnival, a broad based conservation program directed at children in central Oregon elementary schools. This is a collaborative program, supported by Central Oregon Flyfishers, Sunriver Anglers, OR Fish & Wildlife Service, Wolfree, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and Deschutes National Forest. Club members volunteer to help the school children understand all aspects of fisheries, from raising trout eggs to become fry in the classrooms, providing angler education in the classrooms, and conducting multiple days of fishing and education at a kid's fishing pond (club members recently played a major role in the restoration of the pond to improve kid's fishing). There has been lots of recent action in Kokanee Karnival. The Eggs to Fry, Angler Education, Fish Dissection, and Spring Angling Clinic programs have been in full swing, and the Angling clinic finished in early May. Anglers Ed and dissections will be completed in June. Finally, program volunteers staff a week of on-stream class education during the fall spawning season for Kokanee.

Annually, the COF sponsors a project to educate anglers on the 12-mile Wild and Scenic section of the Crooked River to prevent wading in 13 marked redband trout spawning sites. In November, the club has an outing to clean the river banks in the morning and fish in the afternoon, which has become one of our best-attended outings.

The key to having a strong conservation ethic in a fly fishing club is to have a strong mission statement as a foundation, a governing board that believes in conservation, effective use of the club newsletter and monthly meeting to disseminate conservation information, and a wide scope of diverse projects for volunteers to contribute their time. All this can be accomplished with a relatively small budget, because we have a sizable, dedicated volunteer base.

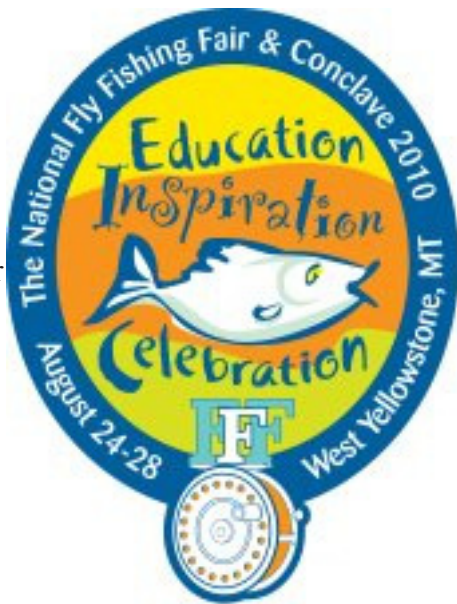




## ***FFF National Chairman/President Visits ORCFFF Expo March 2010***
